The poor on account of their poverty lack of learning and helplessness, are the natural victims of those who seek to make experiments upon their fellows.

The plaintiff has opened a birth-control clinic at 61 Marlborough Road, Holloway in London.

Marlborough Road, Holloway aforementioned is in the centre of a poor and destitute district in London.

The Plaintiff is a doctor of philosophy of the University of Munich in Germany.

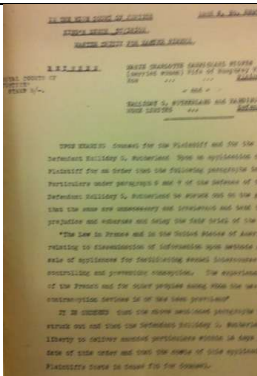
At the said clinic working women have been instructed in the use of a method of contraception known as the check pessary or the small occlusive pessary.

In or about the month of May 1921 a working woman to wit ?? Beatrice Parkinson was so instructed by a certain person who was instructed by a certain person dressed as a nurse whose name is unknown to this Defendant. A large number of woman have received similar instruction at the said clinic. The Defendant is at present unable to give the names of such other persons or the dates upon which such instruction was given.

Professor Louise McIlroy speaking at a meeting of the Medico-Legal Society held on the 7th July 1921 described the said check pessary or small occlusive pessary as "the most harmful method" (that is to say, method of birth control) "of which I have had experience."

The Plaintiff has carried on a campaign in furtherance of birth-control.
